

## Latest Happenings In the Diocese: Mount Saint Joseph Catholic High School Continues to Reap Success

September 2017 marks the start of the fourth academic year since the opening of Mount Saint Joseph Catholic High School. At their Opening Mass, Archbishop Charles H. Dufour congratulated Mrs. Cheryl Ann Gayle, principal, for the schools' first place position with 100% passes in CAPE, an external examination for students who have completed Grade 13. These were the results for the first set of 6th form students accepted to the school, who sat their examinations in 2016.

In the current academic year, MSJCHS has been forced to put their 6th form programme on hold due to lack of space, as the government is a year behind in their construction schedule. MSJCHS however, is grateful to the Passionists who have stepped in to assist by allowing MSJCHS to renovate the ground floor of the former Mt. Calvary Retreat House, to accommodate three classrooms, offices and staff rooms. During the

summer, a walkway was built on the Retreat House property and enclosed by fencing to allow students and staff safe access to this area.

In addition, preparation of an outdoor sports field has been underway, through the generosity of local businesses and donors who have been assisting the school with materials and labour. A roadway had to be prepared, the area had to be flattened, rocks removed, and drainage added. The field is scheduled for completion by the end of the year.

Once again, Food for the Poor continues their generous support to the school with the donation of desks and chairs for students and teachers.
