The Good Shepherd Foundation grew out of a passion of the second Roman Catholic Bishop of Montego Bay for the poor of Jamaica. He had palpable evidence of that poverty when he went to Montego Bay as its Bishop in the late 1900s and was able to galvanize Jamaicans around an organization that would attempt to respond to that need. Among the many needs, health care and education stood out and so the Good Shepherd Foundation has as its purpose to assist the poor and infirmed in Jamaica. Its mission is to provide financial, physical, and moral support to the educational and healthcare needs of the disadvantaged living in the western parishes of Jamaica.

Started in February of 1997, the vision was caught by Jamaicans in Florida, USA, who brought the Friends of Good Shepherd MoBay Inc. into existence. Their assistance to the poor in Jamaica, especially in the areas of education and health has grown from strength to strength. Now congratulations are in order for another group of Jamaicans in Maryland, USA, who have taken up the mantle and started a new Foundation called the Partners of Good Shepherd Jamaica, Inc. who will be focusing on education and healthcare needs. It is all a matter of Jamaicans and fiends helping Jamaicans.

The Good Shepherd Foundation Medical Centre

At this time the Good Shepherd Foundation in Montego Bay, Jamaica has undertaken its first mega project. It is the construction of the Good Shepherd Medical Centre on the grounds of Blessed Sacrament Cathedral. When completed this 30,000 square feet project will house: the Hope Teaching Clinic, a dental facility, a pharmacy, an eye care facility, minor surgery rooms, a nurse's station, staff lounge, conference room, kitchen, large waiting area, several offices, a rehabilitation centre and a chapel.

To date the upper floor is 85% complete while the ground floor is 60% complete and the foundations are 100% complete .

Wall of Friends

The total estimated cost of the construction is US\$ 3.2 million. It is estimated that US\$2.2 million would complete the project and put closure to another venture of The Good Shepherd Foundation. For those who wish to assist that project, their Board of Directors has set up a wall of friends whereby anyone who donates US\$1000 or more and who wishes to be recognized for their support will be publicly acknowledged by having their names added to the Wall of Friends.






