

ach year, this occasion affords us the opportunity to reflect on the blessings in our own lives and the opportunity it gives us to share our blessings with other Jamaicans who are less fortunate than we are. I am very proud of those of my fellow Jamaicans in the Diaspora and of our non-Jamaican friends who support the Partners of Good Shepherd Jamaica (POGS), some of you for the first time. 

begin by stating that as is customary it gives me in estimable pleasure to

send a message from the Good Shepherd Foundation, Montego Bay, to Partners of Good Shepherd Jamaica on the occasion of their 5th annual fundraising function.

Together we have been able to forge visions of aid for a multitude of tasks and to fashion them and see them through, all the while recognizing that His will, not ours be done.

One long term task in particular has consumed us for over four years now and that was and continues to be the project of erecting a 30,000 sq. feet clinic facility on the Blessed Sacrament grounds in Montego Bay, Jamaica. This clinic which had its birth as The Hope Health Teaching Clinic some forty years ago with then Archbishop Egerton Clarke and Sister William Margaret as the visionaries, saw tremendous growth resulting in relocation to a site in Montego Bay, as a result of a partnership of the newly formed Good Shepherd Foundation with its Founder, the then Bishop Charles Dufour and a Canadian charity, The Brenda Strafford Foundation.

When it became clear that the clinic could no longer be housed at Albion the courageous decision was made to build. Construction commenced in January, 2013 and through thick and thin the Friends of Good Shepherd and later joined by Partners of Good Shepherd has walked the walk of the construction of this facility over the past four years and at each annual event we have taken you on the visual journey with us.

Last year we advised you that we had decided to move into one wing of the building, with plans of completing the rest of the building on a phased basis. However, due to overwhelming support, including funds garnered from last year's fundraiser we embraced the possibility of delaying the move while pushing for full completion of the building.

It is therefore with inestimable joy and pride that I inform every single person who has contributed in some way to defraying the gigantic cost of this building, that by the time you read this message we should have moved into the entire building with a view of commencing operations there by June 01, 2017. There will still be some outstanding items, for example, the elevator, solar equipment and other medical equipment but the residential floor for the visiting doctors will be totally completed and furnished and the Clinic itself will be habitable and functioning. We will be able to open our doors to the community which we serve and that ladies and gentlemen is what is important.

Please join with us therefore as together we say "To God Be The glory". We have come this far by faith in a wonderful partnership and we look forward to advising a date before the end of the year for the formal opening of our clinic.

We trust that you will continue to give generously so that we can now effectively equip the building for maximum use and ministry.

May God continue to bless you all!





John BlakeWHUR-FM – Howard University Radio Station

On a summer day in 1972 a young man walked into a trailer, the temporary studio of the then new WHUR-FM, Howard University radio station, with a few Caribbean records under his arm and requested to produce a weekly Caribbean radio show. That individual was Ruthven John Blake.

Born Ruthven John Blake to Leontine and John William Blake, now deceased, on May 1st, 1947 John grew up with his sister, Joan, brother Dr. Winston H. Blake and a cousin Patricia Atwell.

John graduated from San Juan Government School, Nelson Street Boys R.C. School and St. Georges College Barataria, Trinidad. He worked for the government of Trinidad & Tobago in the Ministry of Finance as a Quantity Surveyor for 6 years before migrating to the United States.

John has been the host of the longest-running Caribbean program in the Washington Metropolitan area. Initially, he migrated to the U.S. to be schooled as a building estimator. After realizing the vast opportunity for training and employment in the broadcast field, his first love, he attended The National Academy of Broadcasting in Washington, DC. After graduation he volunteered to produce a weekly program on the recently born WHUR-FM, Howard University Radio in August of 1972. Thus was born The Caribbean Experience, a weekly radio program that has existed for 43 years and continues today. His loyal listeners have made this program an institution in the Washington metropolitan community. He has completed some course work at Howard University, taught radio production, and produced a second radio show on WHUR-World Channel HD2 entitled The World Beat Experience which he co-hosts with Lisa Hollomand. At WHUR-FM John served as News producer, Public Service Director, Production Director and announcer. He was selected as one of the hosts of a Caribbean television program entitled Carib Nation aired here in the U.S. and the Caribbean. These skills extend beyond the Caribbean community as he lectures frequently at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception where several masses are televised world-wide on EWTN television network.

John has received numerous awards from organizations and individuals in the community for his legendary broadcasting skills.





Finally, he encouraged the youth to follow the example of GC Foster who "loved the Lord" and "loved his neighbour".

The youth were divided into teams by civil parish. As always, they competed in such fun activities as netball, football, lime & spoon, 100m and a variety of other races, as well as a tug-ofwar and a bun eating contest. 


